Effective compacts:

- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parent can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom



Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

Every campus will improve student performance on the STAAR/EOC assessment in each of the accountability groups as measured by:

- a. Increasing the number of students passing all tests until 95% are accomplishing this measure.
- b. Reducing the number of students failing more than 1 test.

School Goals

By 2018, 100% of all students will pass every portion of state assessments, and be reading on grade level in grades K-5th.

Our focus in reading will be:

- Sight words and Word Wall words for PreK-2nd grades
- School wide system for summarizing stories, finding main idea, and elements of a story.
