PART I. General Expectations

Oak Dale agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

PART II. Description of how Oak Dale will implement the required components of the campus Title I Parent Engagement Plan.

1. Oak Dale will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its campus Parent Engagement Plan under section 1112 of the ESEA:

- Establish the campus Parent Engagement Advisory Council adequately represented by parents of attending children, administrators and Title I personnel. Other council members may include community members and students.
- Annually hold a meeting to review, discuss, and revise the school's Title I Parent Engagement Plan.
 - Parents will be encouraged to sign up to be part of our campus' Title 1 Parent Engagement Advisory Council. Once the members are established, a meeting and newsletter will be created to explain what Title 1 entails and the importance of parent input. Subsequent meetings will be scheduled to keep parents aware of what is going on at our campus.

2. Oak Dale will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 of the ESEA:

- Hold committee meetings, composed of parents and school staff, to review the Campus Improvement Plan.
 - Parents will be selected based upon their willingness to participate. Meetings will be scheduled, along with information in English and/or Spanish, as requested by the parents.
- Provide Title I, Part A school staff support in enhancing their School Campus Improvement Plans.
 - Staff Training on Title 1 will be provided at our staff development in August.
- Administer the Title I campus Parent Engagement Survey designed to identify the type of support, information, and resources that parents' need included in their Campus Improvement Plan and campus Parent Engagement Plan to better support their children's education and become more involved in their school.

3. Oak Dale will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in the Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting and will encourage them to attend. These informative meetings may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- To engage parents, we will offer information at Back to School Night, tabling during registration, regularly scheduled events, etc.

4. Oak Dale will, in a timely manner, provide parents of participating children information about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the

forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet:

- Information about programs, curriculum, etc. will be made available during Back to School Night/tailgate and will be available throughout the year in the main office.

5. Oak Dale will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible. These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Semester PI meetings, call outs requesting parent feedback, principal regular availability, and a suggestion box will be made available in the office.

6. Oak Dale will provide each parent an individualized student report regarding the performance of their child on the state assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:

- Information will be made available to parents on how to access the information. Parents will be encouraged to contact the school with any questions and concerns as they may arise.

7. Oak Dale will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, on important topics. These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Reviewing and understanding the state's academic content standards.
- Reviewing and understanding the state's student academic achievement standards.
- Reviewing and understanding the state and local academic assessments including alternative assessments.
- The requirements of Title I, Part A.
- How to monitor their child's academic progress.
- How to work with educators.
- Other topics that received strong parent interest as reflected by the Title I school Parent Engagement Survey.

8. Oak Dale will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parent engagement. These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Library Night/Literacy Night
- Math Night
- Science Night
- Discovery Center Night
- Skyward Parent Training
- Parent engagement programs

9. Oak Dale will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools. These efforts may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Parents meeting with campus administrators and teachers to express their thoughts, ideas, etc.

10. Oak Dale will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate Title I parental engagement programs and activities with public preschool and other similar programs (e.g., Head Start, Parents as Teachers, etc.) that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children. These efforts may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Reaching out to new parents/students enrolling in our school for the first time. Encouraging them to come in and visit with the administrators about any questions, concerns, etc. they may have.

11. Oak Dale will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school, parent programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- The use of campus staff or language line as needed to best meet the linguistic needs of all parents and students.

PART III. Discretionary Components of the Oak Dale Title I Parent Engagement Plan
